BLUE LINE CREATIVITY CONTEST

Your school can earn up to \$500 at your designated blue line by simply exchanging an old or used incandescent light bulbs with new compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs. CFL light bulbs will be provided at no charge and each incandescent light bulb exchanged can be redeemed for \$1.00 per light bulb. There will be a maximum of 2 light bulbs per person and 500 light bulbs per school or club. Students participating in this exchange program will be educating people bringing in their light bulbs about energy saving tips upon the exchange.

CFL BULB EXCHANGE PROGRAM

To increase the fun and participation in the Blue Line Project, students can enter to win great prizes by submitting a photo of their creative blue line at www.blueplanetfoundation.org/blueline. Your blue line can be anything from a creative artwork to a written message that portrays hope for saving our planet. Deadline to submit your photo on-line will be October 31, 2009.
